What was once a block of swamp kauri is now a beautifully finished bowl with a quirky look.

Wow! What will we see next week?



JOHN BAKER found a slab of wood from a loquat tree (*right pic*: the delicious fruit from this special tree) This shallow bowl has an amazing array of grain lines and swirls. John reports that the wood is hard, heavy and sands easily. Where can we obtain more of this wood?

Result: One swamp kauri clock and maybe several Brownie points.
