Participants received:

- 7" standard mill mechanism
- A booklet containing a full set of instructions. These instructions have been recently revised to correlate with what tools we have currently available in our workshop.
- 1:1 assistance from the tutor and experienced club mates
- A choice of wood selection



Critical aspects:

- Precise spigot fitting into 35mm spigot jaws
- Success in long-hole boring
- Keeping all parts in line
- Eliminating the turning "wobbles"
- Making and precise fitting a jamb (jam) chuck
- Assembling the parts correctly

*There's a whole heap of procedural learning when making your first salt/pepper mill. You'll manage the fourth or fifth one, etc - with your eyes closed! **Clive***
