Neil Turner Class - Thin Walled Bowl



Wood Requirement

100mm x 100mm x 120mm (sound straight grain timber). Bring several pieces cut to exactly this size so that Neil may advise you on the best for this type of work.

Turning Tool Requirement

Bowl Gouge – small to medium Spindle Gouge - small to medium Round Nose Scraper – 12mm – 25mm wide Skew Chisel – 13mm – 25mm wide Roughing Gouge Parting Tool (Any other tool you think you don't need) Super glue, sanding grits, power sanding (drill) with Velcro sanding pad

Carving

Dremel/ Micro Motor/ Air Tool (any one of these will suffice) With the provision to hold a 3/32 and 1/8 bur CCF cutter 1mm – you MUST have this bur and would be wise to have several. Pencil and Eraser
