

Welcome back for another wood turning year!

TUESDAY Classes 9.00am – 3.30pm THURSDAY CLASSES 6.00pm - 9.00pm

Classes will cater for all experience levels as follows:

**<u>BEGINNERS</u>** will be involved in a <u>sequential-skills programme</u> specifically designed to introduce basic woodturning skills together with the setting of SAFE turning practices. Club members in the beginner (Stage One) group will have all turning wood supplied to them.

**INTERMEDIATE** turners will be encouraged to move on to a series of projects that build on the basic skills, introduce new ideas and challenge thinking about "enhancements" to their work.

The club's **EXPERIENCED** turners generally choose their own projects and work with minimal supervision. However, even at this stage there are still heaps of ideas about wood turning to be learned and mastered. At the experienced developmental stage many turners tend to specialize on style and often introduce artistic elements to their work.

The club is fortunate in having a group of <u>ADVANCED</u> turners who provide inspiration to other club members. They model capabilities and advanced turning techniques. "ADVANCED" members will be encouraged to lead whole-club turning projects.




This regular publication will serve a number of purposes such as:
