**Mill kitsets** have been sourced from Terry Scott (Timberly Turning) and these will be available at a cost of **\$16.00 each**.

**ROBERT Wiseley** has kindly processed a variety of wood ready for this newby project so members will be able to select the wood of their choice for making a pepper mill. As this is their very first mill I have chosen a 7" standard mechanism to be fitted. More complicated fittings may be somewhat further down the turning track.
