

Matai wood - (superb eh)



We're off! The project has started and good progress has been made. Firstly, special thanks to **ROBERT Wiseley** who spent time preparing the square-section blanks. Providing a variety of wood types enabled our project participants to make a choice.



Critical aspects:

- Precise spigot fitting into 35mm spigot jaws
- Success in long-hole boring
- Keeping all parts in line
- Eliminating the turning "wobbles"
- Making and precise fitting a jamb (jam) chuck
- Assembling the parts correctly

PEPPER MILL PROJECT

- 7" standard mill mechanism
- A booklet containing a full set of instructions. These instructions have been recently revised to correlate with what tools we have currently available in our workshop.
- 1:1 assistance from the tutor and experienced club mates
