**DAVID COWLEY** has made himself a penny polishing jig, DVR threaded and all! Goodonya!



Beautiful juniper wood turned into a well-constructed, thin-walled bowl. Top job **ROSS** 





Carefully made by WENDY WHITE this brace of bowls feature a fine stria-free finish, continuous arcs for internal shape and evenly matched wall dimensions. Great work here Wendy!





**COLIN McKENZIE** brought these shells back from his southern holiday jaunt. These shells are FREE to a creative paua-thinking person. If you are interested I can show you how to accurately hollow out an outline of the shell's lip profile so you can inlay the entire shell into a block of your favourite wood. **Right:** Yellow heart Kahikatea wood turned into a super duper platter. Fascinating grain patterns and skillful etchings adds further interest.



**COLIN WHITE** set a strip of copper wire into a hand-made irregularly-spaced groove on the outside of his bowl turning. This is an unusual idea full of interest.

Outside the square, creative thinking well applied here.



**COLIN McKENZIE** discovered a discarded ancient power pole. Although the wood was heavily cracked he was able to extract enough good wood to turn mini objects. Colin reckons the Aussie hardwood is just the best for turning and finishing.



GARY wasn't able to identify this wood. Help anyone?

It is extremely light weight and very soft to cut.

It certainly appears to sand and finish well.
