A reminder about consumable items.


These items include: Various oils; Triple EEE; Traditional wax; sandpapers (astra dot grits) and the range of sanding mandrels.

Goodonya Bill.




It's a classic case of confidence being a forerunner to competence.

## A Message from the club's president


Hello to all our members.
