Many wig stands have now been made as several of our club members donate their time and turning skill to support a most worthy cause






WHOLE CLUB CHALLENGE. This fun exercise starts this coming week.

Set aside your current part-finished turning and join the team of challengers.

A HUMMING SPINNING TOP

INSTRUCTIONS for making he spinning top. (Apologies for them being printed downside up)
Please brin these with you next week.

Make the small handle or button to put on the pull string Make the handle Drill your hole for the metal pin Put the handle of the lid in a chuck and turn the base spigot off. Glue the lid on. Make where the whistle will be on the base. chuck and turn the handle. Make an internal spigot inside the bottom of the lid, turn the lid around in the Make the bottom of the lid so that it fits perfectly in the base – check fit. Next make the lid – have the spigot at the top – don't shape the handle yet. thickness of about 4mm, start to shape the point but leave plenty of wood. The base - have your spigot at the pointy end - hollow out the inside to a wall at both ends before you cut it. The base and lid can be made from one piece, but remember to make a spigot Plus a small handle for the string Handle - 35mm x 185mm long mm08 x msib mm08 - qoT Need 4 pieces - Base - 80mm diam x 100mm Wood required - a dense close grained wood is best - not a soft open grained **4 Taninnige Animmu**
