Newbie turner **HAZEL** has taken up woodturning challenges like a duck to water.


This claret ash bowl was patiently turned from a block of claret ash wood.

"My tomatoes are so big this year that it only takes five of them to make a dozen" (Clive)




RICHARD JACKSON
